

School Uniform Policy



YSGOL GYMRAEG Y LOGIN FACH

It is the policy of Ysgol Gynradd Gymraeg Y Llogin Fach that all children wear school uniform when attending school or when participating in a school organised event outside normal school hours.

The policy for school uniform is based on the notion that school uniform:

- *promotes a sense of pride in the school;*
- *creates a sense of community and belonging towards the school;*
- *is practical and smart;*
- *makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;*
- *is regarded as suitable wear for school and is considered by parents/carers as good value for money.*

The school uniform policy is an integral part of the school's commitment to equality and inclusion. The governing body believes the school uniform policy allows all pupils to establish a shared identity and celebrate what they have in common, whilst respecting diversity.

If in doubt, please check with the school office before purchasing items for wear in school. Our school uniform is as follows:

FORMAL UNIFORM

- *Black trousers*
- *Black skirt*
- *Red jumper with school logo*
- *Red polo shirt*
- *Black shoes*

SUMMER UNIFORM

- *Red gingham dress*
- *Black tailored shorts*

TRACKSUITS

For comfort, the children may wear black track suit bottoms to school.

FOOTWEAR

It is important that your child wears suitable shoes to school on a daily basis – light shoes and those with high heels can harm your child's feet and be the cause of accidents. Shoes must be safe and sensible for playground and indoor use. No narrow or raised heels are allowed. The preferable option is black shoes for all pupils. However we will allow trainers as long as they are completely black and do not have any colourful logos.

EXTREME HAIRCUTS

The school does not permit children to have extreme haircuts or hair colour. When required, unusual hairstyles will be discussed with parents.

JEWELLERY

The School Governors have agreed that it is not appropriate to wear jewellery at school. Pupils will be allowed to wear a watch and stud earrings. Pupils will not be allowed to wear any other type of earrings, necklaces or bracelets. During PE lessons pupils will need to remove their stud earrings or cover them up.

NAMING OF ITEMS AND LOST PROPERTY

Please make sure that the inside of all your child's clothes are clearly marked with the child's name. Shoes should also have names written inside. The school will endeavour to reunite lost named items with their owners. Unnamed lost property will be disposed of at the end of term or recycled.

First names or full names should not be embroidered on school uniform for safety and safeguarding reasons. It is however acceptable for initials to be embroidered on uniform.
